### MOURNING THE LOSS OF A VERY SPECIAL CFS VOLUNTEER

This edition of our newsletter reflects on the life and loss of much loved mother and dedicated CFS volunteer Louise Hincks, who was killed fighting a bushfire near Coles in the South East on 21 January this year.

Hot and windy conditions sparked the bushfire in the South East which burnt out of control until hundreds of volunteer firefighters from around the state contained the blaze.

Louise was one of the volunteer firefighters and in an unforeseen incident, tragically lost her life during this bushfire. Louise was a committed CFS volunteer for 28 years and a beloved member of the Happy Valley CFS brigade where her daughters are also cadets. She was formerly a staff member of SAFECOM where she delivered mental health programs across the state to fellow CFS volunteers. Her loss has been felt across many areas of the Country Fire Service family.

In the same incident, another volunteer was seriously injured but thankfully is recovering.

The CFS Foundation proudly offered immediate financial assistance to both families to give them some peace of mind following the tragic accident. In close collaboration with the CFSVA and SAFECOM, we are working together to ensure Louise's family is cared for and supported.

Louise's commitment to the Country Fire Service has been acknowledged at the South Australia Volunteer Fire Fighters Museum memorial and in Canberra at the National Emergency Services Memorial.

Unfortunately, 85 homes were lost which was devastating for those affected, however, we also recognise the "hundreds of properties saved, maybe thousands, and dozens of lives were saved by the proactive work that was done" said Mark Jones QFSM, Chief Officer SA Country Fire Service.

We are so proud of all our CFS volunteers and it was certainly extra special to have members personally recognised for their outstanding efforts during the catastrophic 2019/2020 Black Summer bushfires.
